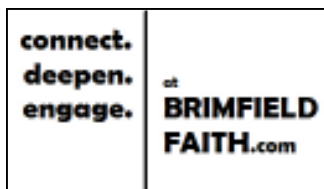
HOCKEY AND BASEBALL

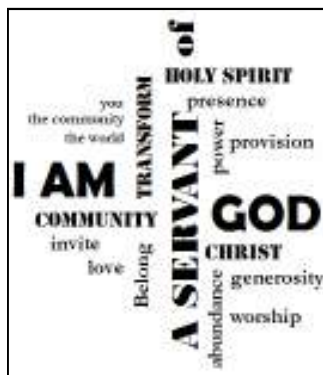
T-SHIRTS
